On a matchday, LCFC Help is also operational through a dedicated text short code service, which can be used to alert our stewards to any situations occurring within King Power Stadium.

Safeguarding At LCFC

LCFC aims to provide a safe environment for everyone. Visiting King Power Stadium, all supporters should be treated with dignity and respect. All staff with responsibility for children, young people and vulnerable groups have a duty to keep them safe and to help protect them from abuse and harm.

On a matchday, you will find helpful contact numbers displayed throughout the concourses. LCFC staff who engage with children undergo a DBS check.

In order to preserve the safety of supporters, the Club does not permit children under the age of 2 to attend matches at King Power Stadium. Children under the age of 16 must be accompanied by a person over the age of 18 when attending a match.

Supporters with Disabilities

LCFC is committed to providing services and facilities for our supporters with disabilities. On matchdays, there is a dedicated stewarding team to help these supporters to ensure they enjoy their matchday experience.

Each area of the ground has access for wheelchair users, while the concourses have accessible toilets, with access granted via RADAR keys, obtained from stewards or a member of our corporate stewards team.

Other facilities available for supporters with disabilities to enhance their matchday experience at King Power Stadium, include:

Audio descriptive service

Headsets with full descriptive commentary can be provided for visually impaired supporters. These are available from the matchday staff entrance an hour and a half before kick-off.
*Failure to return the headset may result in a charge.

Hearing loops

Hearing loops are fitted and clearly signed at various locations around King Power Stadium including the ticket office, Foxes Fanstore, main reception and catering outlets.



Autism pack

Please apply for your pack, including ear defenders, in advance of a home fixture by emailing disability@lcfc.co.uk



Catering

Available in every stand throughout King Power Stadium, fitted with lower level counters.

Seating

Access Stewards will provide blankets and waterproofs on request for your use and return. In addition, the Club also provide wheelchair accessible coach travel for all away fixtures throughout the season. Please see Fox Travel for more information.

LCFC DSA

The LCFC DSA (Disability Support Association) is an independent and voluntary organisation, self-funded by membership fees and fundraising.

Their main aim is to highlight the needs of supporters with disabilities. The LCFC DSA has built a strong working relationship with the Directors and management at the Club to ensure all supporters are treated equally at King Power Stadium.

We are delighted that this has resulted in increased numbers of supporters with disabilities attending matches at King Power Stadium.

The DSA provides its members with advice and support by liaising with the Club on a regular basis. The DSA also hold social events for its members, including quiz nights.

How to Find Us

Train

Leicester Train Station is roughly 1.2 miles from King Power Stadium. This equates to an approximate five-minute car journey or up to a 45-minute walk.

To walk from Leicester Train Station:

- 1 Cross London Road at the traffic lights, turn left and follow the road to King Power Stadium around to the right.
- 2 Keep the Central Ring Road (Waterloo Way) on your left as the path separates from the road, staying on this path as it crosses New Walk.
- 3 The path then re-joins the pavement, at which point Nelson Mandela Park will be in view.
- 4 Turn right onto Lancaster Road and walk through the park, heading for the crossings by the public toilets.
- 5 Cross Welford Road and turn left, following the road around – passing Morrisons supermarket – to King Power Stadium.

Car

The M1 and M69 Motorways interchange at Junction 21 (M1), where you should exit and follow the signs for the City Centre via the A5460.

After three miles, turn right onto Upperton Road, follow the road down until you get to the Liberty Statue Island and take the fifth exit down Western Boulevard. You will then see King Power Stadium on your right-hand side.

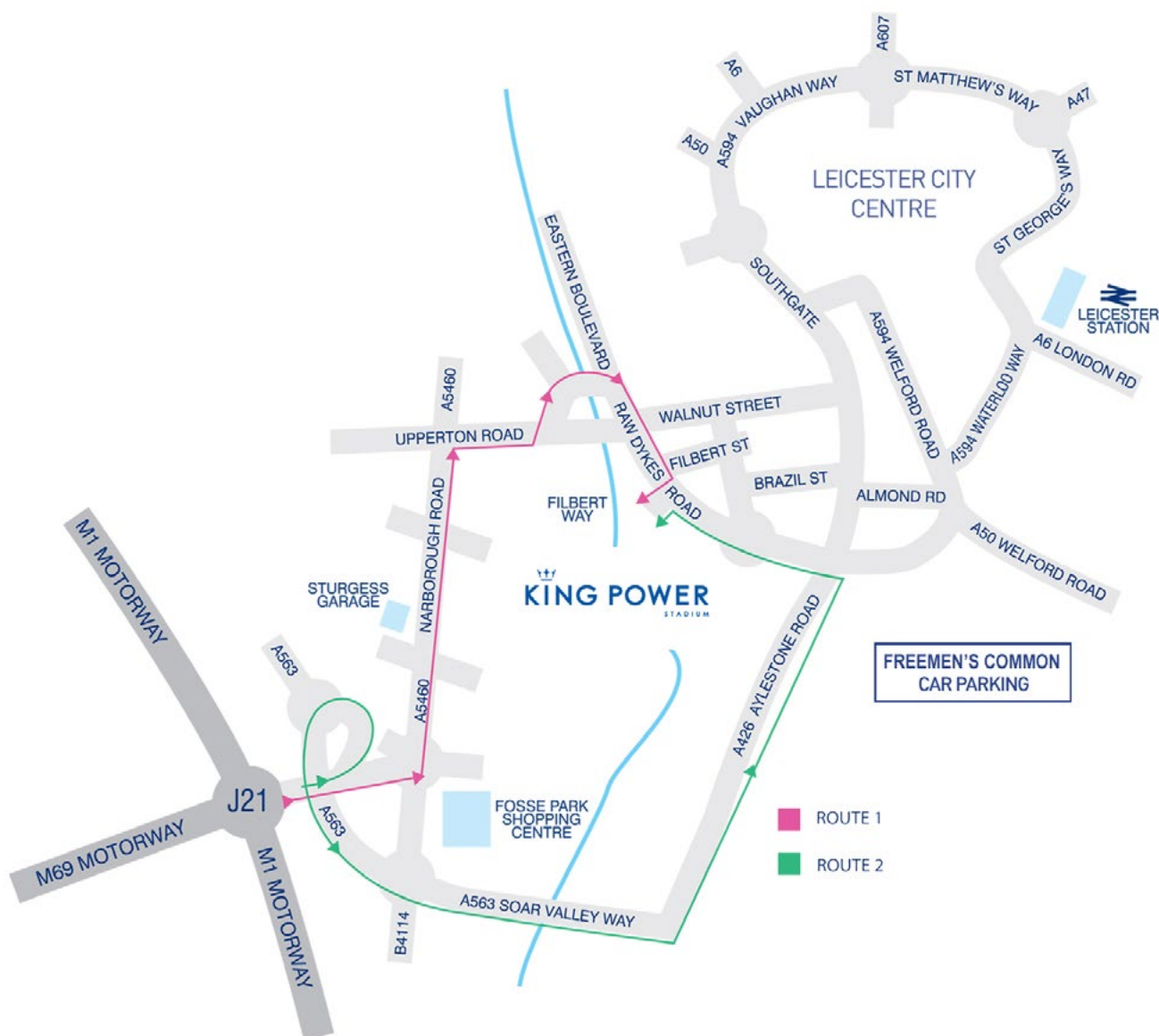
Bus

Several bus services run from Leicester city centre to King Power Stadium, stopping on Aylestone Road, which is a five-minute walk from King Power Stadium.

Most buses in Leicester are low floor vehicles, meaning they can be lowered to pavement level once the bus has stopped. Buses all include wheelchair spaces.

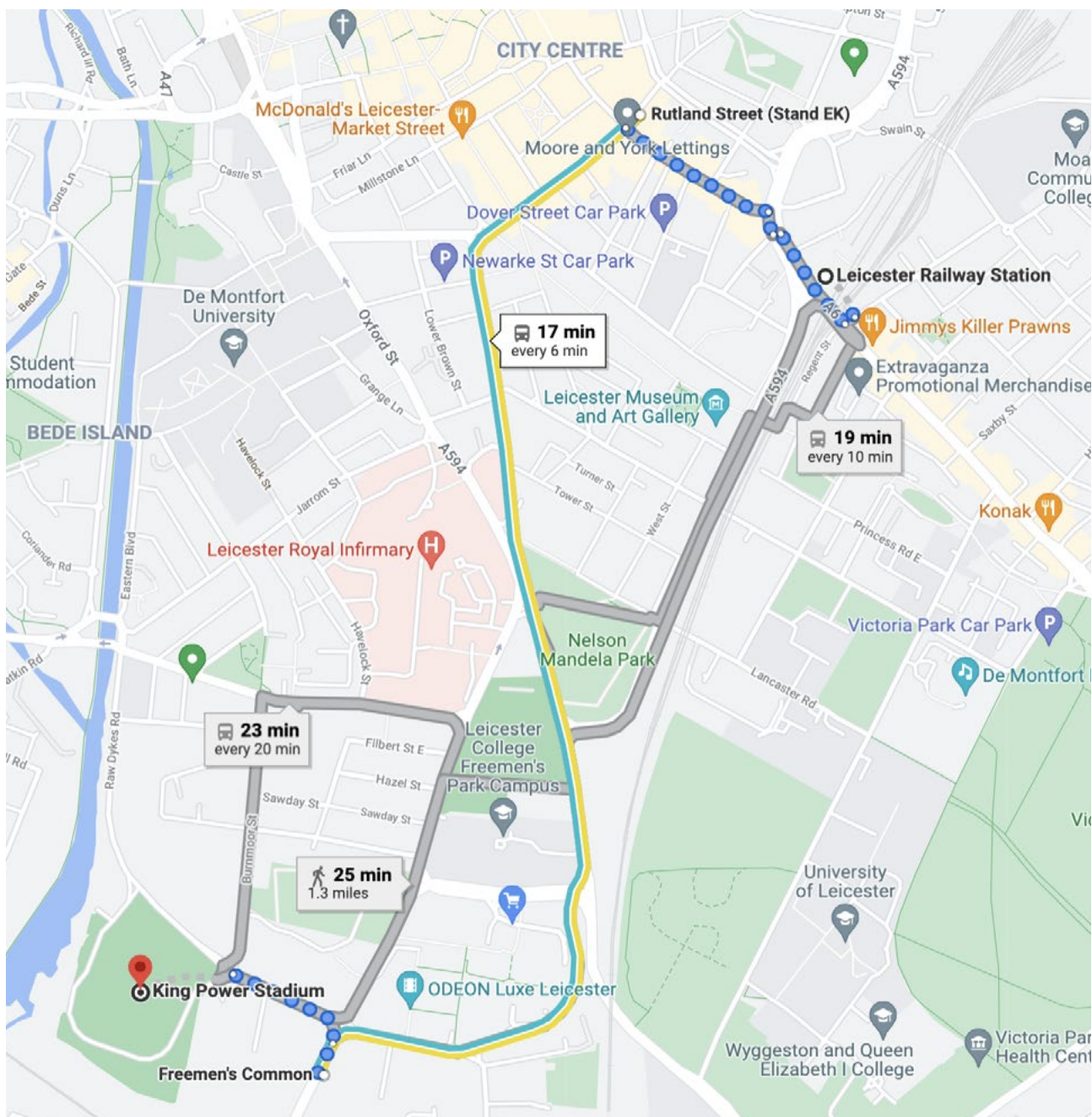


Park & Ride

There are three Park & Ride sites in Leicester, operating from 7am until 7pm, Monday to Saturday.

On Foot

When walking around the local area on a matchday, please do not deviate from the pedestrian footpaths and avoid walking in the road, even if the pavement appears congested. This is particularly important on Aylestone Road and Narborough Road with the number of fast-moving vehicles passing.

Details of known road closures throughout the season will be communicated via the Club's communications channels at the earliest opportunity.

Cycle Park

Leicester City are proud to promote all forms of green travel. As such, the Club encourages local supporters to utilise the cycle park by cycling to King Power Stadium.

For those local to Leicester, cycling offers an attractive alternative, helping minimise the impact of matchday traffic.

Supporters travelling to King Power Stadium on bike can use the cycle park, free of charge. The facility offers 20 spaces on a first come, first served basis. Cyclists should enter via Car Park B and show their match ticket on arrival.

Car Parking

For supporters driving to King Power Stadium, parking can be purchased prior to the day of the match for £18 per car on the Club's Filbert Street car park. To book, please call the City Sales Centre on 0344 815 5000 (Option 1) or online at ticketsinfo@lcfc.co.uk

There are also several independent car parks in the area surrounding King Power Stadium. The car parks are situated around Freemans Common and Leicester Tigers Rugby Stadium which is around a 10-minute walk from King Power Stadium.

Season Tickets

Leicester City has once again sold its full allocation of Season Tickets for the 2023/24 season.

A number of 2022/23 Fox Members were also able to secure Season Tickets for 2023/24.

Matchday Tickets

Fox Membership continues to be the best chance for supporters to secure match tickets for EFL Championship fixtures at King Power Stadium.

With tickets in high demand and no guarantee of fixtures reaching general sale, those who wish to be closer to the action this season – and for seasons to come – are advised to join the scheme.



Mobile Tickets

Mobile Tickets (also known as NFC) are the default option for all Match Ticket purchasers at King Power Stadium, with 2023/24 Season Ticket Holders given the choice to opt-in or out of Mobile Ticketing for 2023/24.

The use of mobile tickets is now commonplace for mass spectator events all over the world. Through the reduction, and eventual removal, of physical tickets and transferring to tickets being held on smartphones, venues all over the world have been able to improve security, tackle ticket touting and reduce the carbon footprint created by printing thousands of paper and plastic tickets for every event.

Fox Membership

Fox Memberships for the 2023/24 season are now on sale, with the latest scheme offering a sense of belonging for supporters alongside an improved fan experience.

Cup Tickets

Please note that cup tickets are **NOT** included in Season Tickets.

Season Ticket Holders will be given a priority window in which to purchase their own seat for any cup tie. This window will be available for a limited period, which will be communicated through the Club's official channels.

As a Season Ticket Holder, once the deadline for purchasing your own seat has passed, all seats will be released for sale to Fox Members. If you do not wish to purchase your usual seat for the match, you will need to wait until tickets go on sale to Fox Members. All tickets are subject to availability.

Should the Club decide to open part of the stadium, no seats will be placed on reserve, however, Season Ticket Holders will have a priority window to purchase an alternative seat.

To purchase tickets during the Season Ticket Holders' sales period, supporters should sign into their [LCFC.com](https://www.lcfc.com) account or call the City Sales Centre on 0344 815 5000 (Option 1).

Once the Season Ticket Holder sales period has passed, any remaining tickets will be made available to Fox Members. Tickets can then be purchased at one ticket per Membership, subject to availability.

To purchase tickets during the Fox Members' sales period, supporters should sign into their [LCFC.com](https://www.lcfc.com) account or call the City Sales Centre on 0344 815 5000 (Option 1).

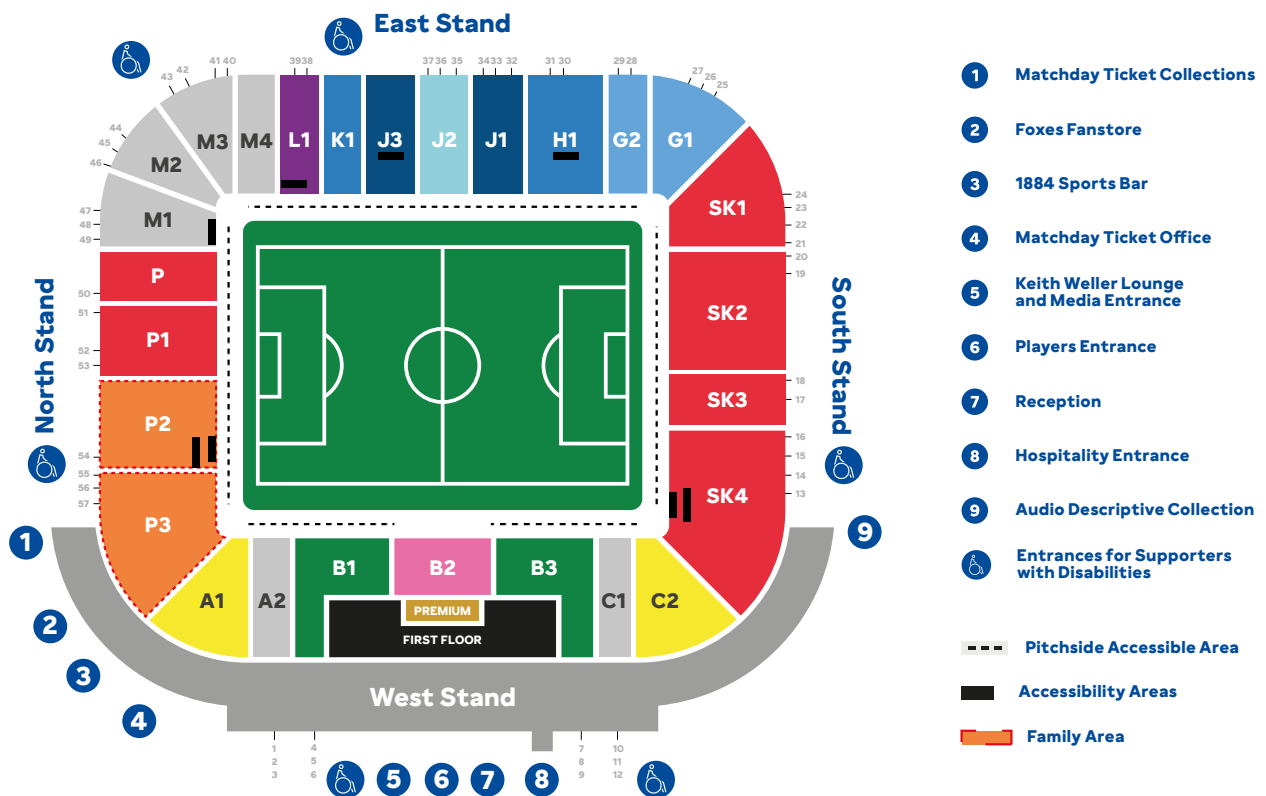
Cup tickets will be made available on general sale at the Club's discretion, should any remain beyond the Season Ticket Holders' and Fox Members' sales periods.

Changes to Dates, No Refunds and Exchanges

No guarantees can be given by the Club that a match will take place at a particular time or on a particular date. Match dates may be subject to change from time to time due to reasons beyond the Club's control (including, without limitation, television scheduling, cup competitions, participation in European tournaments by other clubs or adverse weather conditions). The Club reserves the right to reschedule any match without notice and without any liability. Changes will be announced on the Club's social media channels.

In the event of the postponement or abandonment of a match (or if the match has, for any reason, to be played out of view of the public or with limited/restricted attendance with the result that you are unable to use the relevant ticket), you will be entitled to receive the equivalent ticket for the subsequent re-arranged match via such application procedure as the Club stipulates from time to time. The Club will have no further liability whatsoever.

Tickets are non-refundable and non-transferable if you are unable to attend a fixture for any reason. Refunds will only be considered in exceptional circumstances and any refunds will be solely at the Club's discretion. In all cases, the Club's decision is final. Where any tickets are purchased from a reseller (and not the Club), the Club shall not be liable for any refunds of tickets purchased under any circumstances whatsoever. Tickets cannot be downgraded for any supporter who would qualify for a lower concession price.

Away Fixtures

With limited away allocations, Leicester City operates a tiered sales approach to these fixtures, with sales staggered to Season Ticket Holders by number of Away Priority Points earned.

Should tickets remain for fixtures after all points thresholds have had a chance to purchase, tickets will go on sale to all Season Ticket Holders first, followed by all Fox Members, though this is not guaranteed.

Supporters should note that away tickets are non-refundable and cannot be upgraded once they have been purchased, cannot be relocated. All purchases are subject to availability and T&Cs. All tickets must be used by the named ticket holder.

Subject to availability, please note on some occasions, a window may not be available to the supporters. The Club will inform Season Ticket Holders of selling arrangements for each game.

Visiting Supporters

Visiting supporters are accommodated in the corner of the North and East stands – all seats have unrestricted views.

These supporters can access their area through turnstiles 40 to 49 (dependant on ticket allocation) up to 90 minutes before kick-off. The accessible entrance is at turnstiles 42 to 43.

Visiting supporters with disabilities can purchase car park spaces for £10.50 per car from their respective club, before the day of the game.

A Safe & Inclusive Environment

The Club celebrates diversity and works to create an experience on matchdays and non-matchdays that is safe and enjoyable for all. The Club welcomes all to King Power Stadium, regardless of age, disability, gender, race, faith, sexual orientation or any other protected characteristic.

For Season 2022/23, The FA, Premier League and EFL together introduced new measures and stronger sanctions across the game to tackle the increased anti-social and criminal behaviours recently seen within football grounds and underline the importance of a safe matchday environment. This work will continue into Season 2023/24.

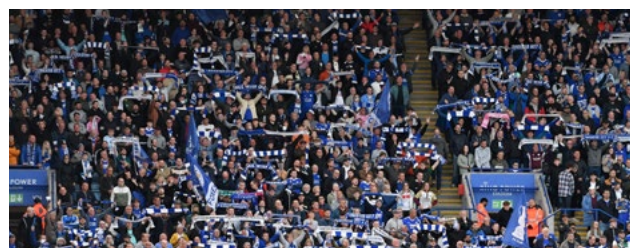
All identified offenders will be reported by the Club to the police and prosecution could result in a permanent criminal record, which may affect their employment and education, and could result in a prison sentence.

All supporters and staff must be treated fairly and with respect.

The Club condemns, and does not tolerate, any form of discriminatory, abusive, and/or anti-social conduct or behaviour at King Power Stadium and any other football stadium. If the Club finds any supporter committing any of the prohibited offences or behaviours at, around or on the journey to/from King Power Stadium or any other football stadium, or via online media or any other media, the Club shall be entitled to impose such sanctions on the supporter as it considers appropriate in the circumstances, which may include (by way of example) match bans, a lifetime ban from all Club fixtures, the withdrawal of tickets and/or memberships, without reimbursement, and/or the removal of any Club benefits (including priority points).

Supporters are reminded that the King Power Stadium Ground Regulations and any applicable Supporter Code of Conduct, must be adhered to at all times.

Where applicable, Club sanctions will be issued in accordance with the Club's Sanctions and Appeals process, taking into account applicable policies and guidance (including the Premier League Commitment regarding Discriminatory and Abusive Conduct).





Social Media Sanctions Policy

LCFC's Social Media Banning Policy, which can be found on the Club's website at [LCFC.com/equality/discrimination](https://www.lcfc.com/equality/discrimination), states that any individuals or groups observed to be making discriminatory or abusive comments on Leicester City Football Club's official social media channels, should be banned using each social network's reporting/banning mechanism.

Any online conduct deemed to be a "Prohibited Activity" under the Premier League Commitment will be dealt with in accordance with the agreed process set out in section C of the PL Commitment.

Leicester City is a family club and is connected online with supporters of all ages from a wide variety of backgrounds. As such, the Club's social media accounts should harbour an environment and community that is welcoming and free of inappropriate messages/behaviour.

The Club's Content Department regularly monitor posts for such behaviour and other online users may report incidents of online abuse to the Club. The remit of the Club's Sanctions Committee extends to all forms of abuse and/or inappropriate behaviour and so supporters found to be committing online offences may be subject to Club sanctions.

Sanctions are imposed for, but not limited to, swearing, threatening messages, any post that discriminates against protected characteristics and other behaviour that the Club deems inappropriate on its channels. All banned/blocked accounts from LCFC media channels are made at the Content Department's discretion.

LCFC does not tolerate online abuse in any form and if you are a Season Ticket Holder, Member, or match by match purchaser of tickets to Club fixtures conducting such abuse, you will be referred to the Club's Sanctions Committee who will consider whether to issue a sanction to you in respect of your online activity.

If you use online abuse on non-LCFC media channels, towards the Club, our players, or staff, you will be reported to the social network company and if you are a Season Ticket Holder, Member, or match by match purchaser of tickets to Club fixtures, you will be referred to the Club's Sanctions Committee who will consider whether to issue a sanction to you in respect of your online activity.

In addition online abuse can be reported directly to the Premier League by taking a screen shot of the alleged abuse and emailed to onlineabuse@premierleague.com.

Sanctions & Appeals

Depending on the severity and nature of your conduct/offence, the Club's Sanctions Committee may review the conduct/offence and issue sanctions as it sees fit.

The sanction may include (without limitation) a written warning, the removal of priority points, match bans, a seasonal ban and/or a lifetime ban.

Second offences will automatically carry a lengthier ban.

Appeals Process

If you have been issued with a Club sanction and wish to appeal such sanction, you must lodge your appeal to the Club's Board Office. This can be done either by sending a signed letter addressed to Board Office, Leicester City Football Club, King Power Stadium, Filbert Way, Leicester LE2 7FL or by emailing boardoffice@lfcfc.co.uk stating the reason for your appeal and providing any supporting evidence, within seven days of the date of the letter confirming your sanction.

Your appeal will be brought before the Club's Appeals Committee (separate to the Sanctions Committee) as soon as is reasonably possible, and the Appeals Committee will endeavour to advise you of the outcome of your appeal within 14 days of a decision being made.

The Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha Foundation

The LCFC Foxes Foundation was renamed The Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha Foundation in November 2018 in honour of Leicester City's late Chairman, Khun Vichai, who tragically lost his life in a helicopter accident in October 2018, along with four other people.

The VS Foundation is committed to giving back to the Leicestershire community by raising large sums of money for life-changing causes in the county that have a real impact on the lives of those in need.

With former player and legendary Club Ambassador Alan 'The Birch' Birchenall as its driving force, the Foundation uses the reach of the Premier League, the passion of fans and a creative approach to fundraising to benefit its community in a number of ways. The Foundation was formed in 2011/12 with the launch of the 'One In A Million' campaign, which looked to take the total of £850,000 already raised by The Birch beyond the £1M mark.

This feat was achieved in the very first season thanks to a host of fundraising events, that culminated in Birch's Annual Run around the pitch prior to the team's final home game of the campaign.

Money raised over the past decade has gone towards several important causes, including the funding of a renovation of Leicester Royal Infirmary's Children's Outpatient Ward, lifesaving equipment desperately needed by the Children's Intensive Care Unit, and the restoration of Leicester Cathedral.

Furthermore, dozens of local causes have been supported, including Leicester Hospitals Charity, LOROS, Rainbows Children's Hospice and Leicestershire Children's Holiday Centre, as well as the installation of several life-saving defibrillators in key areas around the city and county and the funding of a Professorship in Child Health at the University of Leicester.

More recently, in April 2022, the VS Foundation donated all funds raised throughout the month to Leicester Hospitals Charity's Neonatal Incubator Appeal. In a month where the Club unveiled a statue of Khun Vichai outside King Power Stadium, the Foundation continued to uphold a key part of the former Chairman's legacy by supporting key charitable causes in its communities. Following this, LCFC Chairman and Khun Vichai's son, Khun Aiyawatt Srivaddhanaprabha, donated £1M to the Appeal at the Club's End of Season Awards in May 2022, with The Birch's 40th and final annual End of Season Run focusing on raising funds to support the Appeal.

To date, the The Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha Foundation has raised an incredible £5M for local Leicestershire causes.

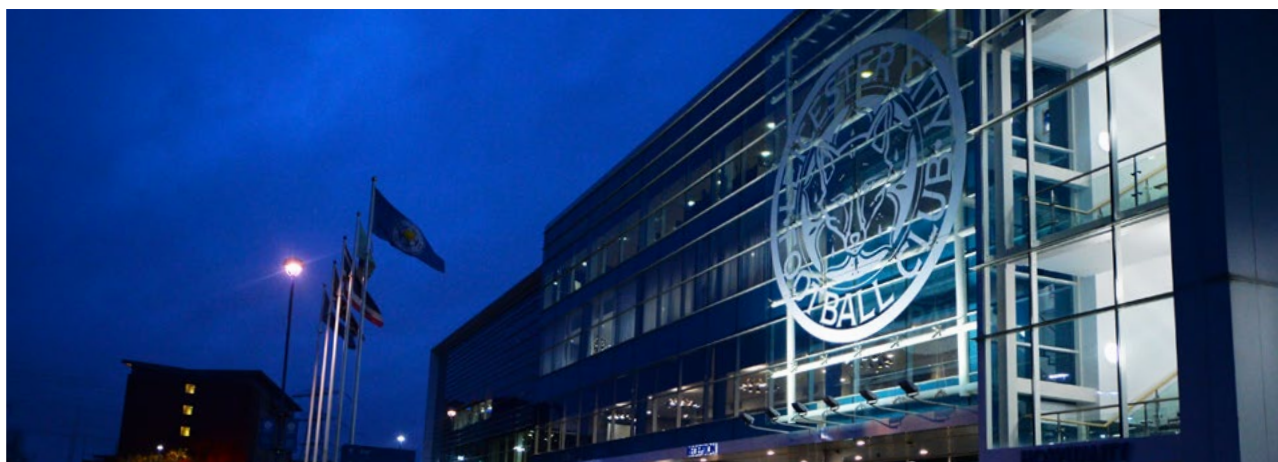
